BY THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF SMYRNA

In Recognition of Juneteenth June 19, 2023

- Whereas, on June 19th in the United States to commemorate the end of slavery; and Juneteenth, also known as Freedom Day or Emancipation Day, is celebrated each year
- Whereas, day-to-day lives, particularly in Texas, which was almost entirely under Confederate an effective date of January 1, 1863, it had minimal immediate effect on most slaves' though the Emancipation Proclamation had been issued on September 22, 1862, with
- Whereas, enforce the emancipation of its slaves; and Juneteenth commemorates June 19, 1865, the day Union General Gordon Granger and 2,000 federal troops arrived in Galveston, Texas, to take possession of the state and
- Whereas, encouraging self-development and respect for all cultures; and of June 19th was coined "Juneteenth" and grew with more participation from descendants. Juneteenth today celebrates African American freedom while Juneteenth is the oldest known celebration of the ending of slavery. The celebration
- Whereas, on June 17, 2021, the Juneteenth National Independence Day Act was signed into law, which established Juneteenth as an official federal holiday; and
